<u>'Notebook Rules</u>

- 2. No scratch marks over mistakes. Please use your eraser or white out.
- 3. Copy everything the teacher writes.
- 4. Colors should be used only to highlight information and label diagrams. All other work should be done with a pencil.
- 5. Check work and make corrections to everything, when needed.
- 6. Make up any notes you miss due to absences.

<u>Homework</u>

- Homework assignments are worth 2 points each. To earn the full 2 points, the complete assignment must be attempted with work shown. You will receive only 1 point for an assignment if it is only half done. You will receive o points for an assignment if you do not have it in class for any reason, or if you have answers with no work to support them. Late assignments can be completed for 1 point. Be sure to show any work to support the answer to receive full credit. If you are struggling to obtain the correct answer, bring the work you have already done.
- You may earn a **HOMEWORK PASS** by having an A average in the homework category at progress report time and at report card time. Passes may only be used for one math assignment each by the expiration date.
- Assignments should be written in your planner every day. They will also be posted on Aspen and on the 6th Grade Google Site.

<u>Quiz Retake Policy</u>

- All students have 3 school days after receiving a graded quiz to correct their mistakes.. You must show all work and explain your mistake on the Quiz Corrections worksheet. Staple your corrections to the top of your original quiz and turn in by the due date.
- If you receive a D or an F on a quiz, you will meet with me during WIN to conference about your mistakes before correcting them. Quiz corrections are mandatory in this case.
- Once Quiz Corrections are complete, time will be arranged for you to retake the quiz. You
 only have ONE chance to retake the quiz, so make sure you are ready. Your grade will be
 changed reflecting the better of the two grades.

- Tests will occur at the end of each unit. We will have a review day in class prior to the test, and two class periods will be scheduled for you to take the test.
- Tests will consist of a few non-calculator questions, multiple choice PSSA style questions, and open ended questions.
- There will be no retakes allowed.
