



I want my children to be productive citizens that can communicate with others, be kind and hardworking, and be successful This is my goal as a parent














How to solve problems and realize that life does not offer a safe space every time you want it. Sometimes




Have students understand that college is not for everyone because there is not need to be in debt because they thought they had to go to college
